Seven options for Adult Faith Formation: (Please check which one(s) you are interested in joining.)

A. "To Preserve Life': A Narrative Study of the Book of Genesis" -- This seminar discussion group led/taught by Dr. Kent J. Lasnoski (Assistant Professor of Theology at Wyoming Catholic College) invites participants to six weeks of engaging salvation history through a close reading of the book of Genesis. No video presentations, no special study books to order. Just a couple questions to ponder for each section of Genesis and a time of discussion that will change and/or deepen the way we encounter God's saving action in history and our own life. All are welcome. **Thursday nights at 8 at the home of Dr. Kent and Caitlyn Lasnoski**

B. Debbie Barry will lead "Growing a Mary Heart in a Martha World." This would be a bible study/prayer group for women. "The curriculum is geared toward women and is amazing. I plan on praying a "spiritual bouquet" for various groups of women (Women of the Holy Rosary Parish, women who are in nursing homes, women who are in a crisis pregnancy, etc.) In no way do I see myself as a theologian, but just a parishioner who desires to grow in the Lord with others." **6:30-7:30 p.m, Monday or Tuesday** (Circle which day(s) you are available to meet.)

C. "Seekers of Spirituality" is an ongoing women's group which meets **the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of every month at Two Sisters Bed and Breakfast from 1 – 3 p.m.** They are currently studying The Gospel of John, using the St. Ignatius Catholic Study Bible, and are on Chapter 13. They welcome new members.

D. "The Conversion of the Vikings" – Father James will conduct a history class exploring the story of how Christianity came to the Vikings. **Wednesdays from 6-7 p.m. in the rectory.**
